

Competition rules

Draw organised by LISER

1. The Luxembourg Institute of Socio-Economic Research, hereinafter referred to as "LISER" or "Centre", established at Maison des Sciences Humaines 11, Porte des Sciences, L-4366 Esch-sur-Alzette/Belval, represented by its statutory bodies currently in office, is organising a competition relating to the "**WinWin4WorkLife - employee Study**" (hereinafter referred to as the "Study").
2. Participation in the competition begins on 1st July 2025 and ends at the close of the Study or, failing that, on 30 November 2025.
3. The competition is open to individuals (hereinafter referred to as 'participants') who have consented to take part in the Study and meet the following conditions: be eligible for the Study, complete the online questionnaire - this is referred to as partial participation - and complete the time use dairy - this is referred to as full participation.
4. Staff members (salaried and self-employed) of the Centre organising the competition, as well as family members of the above-mentioned persons, may not take part in this competition.
5. 25 Amazon vouchers on the German or French site worth EUR 100 are up for grabs for a full participation, 100 Amazon vouchers on the German or French site worth EUR 25 are up for grabs for a partial participation.
6. 2 draws will be held by a LISER employee appointed for this purpose:
 - The first once the online survey closes, at the latest on 30 October 2025
 - The second when the survey with time use dairy closes, at the latest on 30 November 2025.

At the first draw, 100 participants in the partial study will be drawn at random and declared winners. At the second draw, 25 participants in the full study will be drawn at random and declared winners. The winners of the competition will be notified and will receive their prize by email. Providing an incorrect email address will result in cancellation of the prize.

7. Participation in the competition implies acceptance of these rules. The full text of the rules is filed with the TAPELLA & NILLES law firm of bailiffs at 14-16, rue du Canal; L-4050 Esch/Alzette and can be consulted on the www.tapella-nilles.lu website.
8. Participation in the competition is free. You can only enter as described in these rules.
9. No complaints will be accepted regarding the organisation of this competition, except in the event of serious or intentional misconduct on the part of the person in charge of the Centre.

Similarly, the designation of the winners may not be contested under any circumstances, for any reason whatsoever, except in the case of serious or intentional misconduct.

10. Vouchers won may not be exchanged by the LISER for other products or services, nor for their cash equivalent. The awarding of these vouchers may not be contested under any circumstances, for any reason whatsoever, except in the event of serious or intentional misconduct on the part of the Centre manager.
11. LISER undertakes to comply with current data protection regulations.
LISER collects identification data on the basis of participants' consent for the purposes of registering and managing lottery participants.
LISER undertakes to use personal data solely for the purposes for which it was collected and to keep it confidential. No personal data is passed on to third party organisations.
LISER undertakes to facilitate the exercise of the rights of the persons concerned by the means communicated to the participant for this purpose.
All data collected for the purposes of this competition will be destroyed by LISER at the close of the lottery.
12. Any liability on the part of the Centre and its bodies, employees and agents in connection with this competition, for any legal reason whatsoever, is limited to cases of wilful misconduct and gross negligence.
13. The competition organisers reserve the right to modify or suspend the competition in the event of a major event making it impossible to hold the competition. In the event that certain clauses are or become invalid, the other participation conditions will apply.
14. The competition and any question relating to the interpretation of its rules is subject to Luxembourg law and falls within the jurisdiction of the Luxembourg courts.
